Greetings St. John's,

This March brings change. We have new council Presidents in Zach Radloff and Jim Meyer. I know that they will do great things! We have faithful council Presidents who are stepping away. Our thanks to Keith Johnson and John Fuelling for their service and for steering the ship(s) during one of the most challenging times in church history. My guess is that when they signed up they probably didn't know that they would be steering decisions about masks, closing and reopening of church, distancing, how to do communion safely and other things that aren't in the usual church council playbook. They have our gratitude and respect!

Change is hard but it's part of God's plan for us. My guess is that you know Ecclesiastes chapter 3. For two reasons; -the first eight verses of that chapter are used in "Turn! Turn!" by "the Byrd's". That's a pretty good song. -we use Ecclesiastes chapter 3 in funerals.

While funerals are a great use and I like that old song Ecclesiastes chapter 3 also reminds all of us that God is constantly bringing change into our lives! Why? So we can grow. The church is his bride and he's always making that bride more beautiful. Also he's working to shape you and I to look more like Christ. That requires change and challenge. Both of those things are good but in the moment they create a bit of anxiety and discomfort. That's how you know it's working!

Ecclesiastes chapter 3 shows us that there's a time and place for everything. For example, verse 5 states that there is a time to embrace and a time to refrain from embracing, (NRSV). We are obviously in a season of refraining from embracing due to the pandemic. Thankfully that season is starting to come to a close. Verse 7 mentions that there is a time to mend. I believe we are in that season now as businesses and churches start to work towards normalcy or a "new normal". Verse 8 tells us that there is a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace (NRSV). Boy does that feel relevant now.

My hope is that we are in a time of peace. Washington DC is far away but we feel that impact of that conflict everywhere. Sometimes in our own homes. It makes conversation with neighbors, friends, and co-workers more difficult and tense. Let's embrace this time of peace and mending. Let's embrace this time of change. Our Father is always working for us so I know it will all work out for our good in the end. We tend to focus on those first eight verses in Ecclesiastes chapter three but there's more to the chapter. Verse 14 says this in part "I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it and nothing taken from it" (NRSV). That's very good for us because he sent his only begotten son to die for us. That work will endure for ever and because of that, so will you. The time and season that we look forward to is the eternity. All of those other times before that are temporary.

As I write this I'm putting on "The Byrds" Greatest Hits because "Mr. Tambourine Man" and all of those songs are pretty good. It's hard to beat the sound of that 12 string Rickenbacker guitar!

The officers will remain the same. President Jason Klinge, Vice President Brad Hoth and Secretary Treasurer Don Bossard.







A Path to Hope and Healing

Mike remembers feeling angry and depressed, and his family was at risk of falling apart. When he decided to start Therapy Services with LSI, he questioned the decision. Therapy wasn't easy and when he missed an appointment, he didn't want to go back.

But through working with his LSI therapist, Sherry, for the past several months, he has found ways to grow and heal. During each session, Sherry is there to listen without judgement, and she provides a listening ear for anything Mike wants to talk about. At the end, Mike is always given a type of homework or a lesson to think about until they meet again.

While they originally began meeting in person, Sherry has continued to be available through virtual therapy throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. The virtual sessions ensure Sherry and Mike can continue meeting regularly, on a flexible schedule and from the safety of their own homes.

"Thank God for working through LSI in-person and through telehealth, and especially for Sherry, who helps people like myself who have been lost for years. If I hadn't chosen LSI, I wouldn't have met my therapist who has truly helped me keep my family and stay alive," Mike says. "I look back at the progress I have made and see some light peeking through to the end."

World Day of Prayer • March 5, 2021 "Build on a Strong Foundation"

This year, the women of the World Day of Prayer Committee of Vanuatu call us to worship with the words "Build on a strong foundation," inspired by Matthew 7:24–27. We are invited to learn about Vanuatu's history and rich culture. The women share their stories of intergenerational wisdom, traditions, and experiences of God's profound love.



The WDP 2020 program explores the passage in which Jesus tells a story about the kingdom of heaven, using the image of a house and the land on which the house is built. Choosing the land on which to build a house is an important decision for people in Vanuatu. Considering both the terrain and the climate is crucial in a tropical archipelago located in the South Pacific Ocean and prone to earthquakes, cyclones, volcanic eruptions and rising sea levels.

In Jesus' story, the wisdom of the builder of the house comes from hearing and acting on the word of God, which is a word of love. This is the foundation on which our sisters call us to build our homes, our nations, and the world. A call of faith to be earnestly considered when responding to the prayer of commitment: "What is the house that you would build?"

WDP's guiding principles affirm that "prayer is rooted in listening to God and to one another." Through the worship service, we listen to the people of Vanuatu. They take us to their communities and through their concerns. Their everyday life is woven into their prayers. They invite us to follow prayer with action. WDP's motto "Informed prayer leads to prayerful action" affirms that prayer and action are inseparable and that both have immeasurable influence. Let us walk in faith and prayerful action!





About World Day of Prayer

Since the nineteenth century, Christian women in the United States and Canada have initiated cooperative activities in many areas of concern for women and children, recognizing the critical role of prayer in mission work and their call to promote world

peace through worldwide mission work. The first organized "day of prayer for the world" was held in Canada on January 9, 1920. The United States soon followed on February 20, 1920.

Now, hundreds of thousands of women (and men, youth, and children) from around the world and in every region gather to collectively worship on the first Friday in March. Each year, a different country serves as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service and other materials. Women of that country's national WDP committee interpret scripture within their cultural context and prepare a worship service; women around the world lead the services.

World Day of Prayer is supported by sacrificial and benevolent mission offerings given by individuals through these annual services. Each of the 170 countries celebrating World Day of Prayer has an ecumenical committee of women representing many cultures, races and faith traditions. Each country's committee is responsible for determining the use of the offering as it relates to the theme for each year. Offering grants are made to women and children's groups in each country.

All: Almighty God, protect the communities from disasters and suffering. Heal the souls of the people and help them feel your love.

Leader 4: Let us pray together the Lord's Prayer.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

Closing Hymn: "Lord, Dismiss Us with Thy Blessing"

Leader 1: We welcome God's dwelling presence in and with us. Let God guide you, lead you, restore you, and heal your nation. Let God's will be done in your house as it is in heaven. Listening to Voices from Vanuatu

Listening to the Word of God

Leader 2: Let's hear the word of God according to the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 7, verses 24–27. (Reader reads scripture.)

Leader 3: The main Bible text for this year's World Day of Prayer is based on the teachings of Jesus in Matthew 7:24–27, specifically his instructions for entering the kingdom of heaven.

(Leader offers additional insights into the scripture, concluding with the following.)

Reflect on the following questions and share with the person next to you:

- 1. Jesus used two verbs to emphasize his message: hear and act (vs 24 and 26). How do these verbs make you feel or what other scripture do they remind you of?
- 2. In your context, what makes someone wise? What makes someone foolish?
- 3. Imagine you were part of the crowd when Jesus gave these instructions. How would you have reacted?

Let us rise and build our homes, our nations and the world on the words of Jesus, who reminded us about the golden rule—"In everything, do to others as you would have them do to you" (7:12). This is our solid foundation. This is the basic principle of our message today.

Leader 4: Gracious God, we thank you and worship you for all the blessings you have bestowed on us, for family and friends, home, food and water. We praise you for leading us to be creative and able to support our families. We offer to you a small portion of these blessings of money and service. We dedicate them to the World Day of Prayer, knowing these gifts will be shared with communities in need here and around the world. Amen.
