

It's July and it's a quieter time on the church calendar. As Christians and Lutherans our focus turns to the celebration of our nation. This may come as a shock to you but our nation isn't perfect: We're still working on some things. America has been called the great experiment so we are figuring things out as we go along. Some of the turmoil and debates that we have are part of that experiment and the march of progress. The founders of our nation knew a couple of humbling truths. They weren't sure if this thing of ours would work or not and they also knew that they didn't know everything. They knew that for the experiment to work that there would be change that they couldn't foresee.

We love this experiment while acknowledging that it's very much a work in progress. I have to be honest, sometimes I tune out the news and I watch simple movies and fun stuff. While I want to know what's going on in the world, too much of it can be disheartening. What I choose to focus on is what I love about this nation. I love the fact that we are an experiment and that things change and progress over time. Sometimes things get a little crazy and then there is a reaction to that. Somehow it balances itself out over time.

This month as we celebrate our 245th year as a nation I give thanks for this nation. I give thanks for our freedom to worship. I give thanks for the freedom to choose. I give thanks for the freedom to have our own opinions. I give thanks for the opportunities that this country gives to us all.

Our founding fathers were people of faith. They did not however all share the same faith. George Washington was an Episcopalian, John Adams came from the Reformed/Congregationalist tradition and later became a Unitarian. James Madison was raised as a Presbyterian. Many of them had a complex relationship with Christianity. For example Thomas Jefferson wrestled with faith his entire life and wrote "The Life and Morals of Jesus of Nazareth" and "The Jefferson Bible". However he didn't like organized religion and had beliefs that wouldn't pass muster in most churches.

They had different beliefs but in general they believed that God is needed in our nation. They believed that differences in belief and worship should be embraced. They believed in the rights of every person and although we're still working on that aspect, they thankfully gave us the framework for more freedom for all. It certainly wasn't perfect in 1776, it's not perfect now but in this great experiment we're able to continuously work on that. That's something to celebrate and thank God for. I leave you with Peter's thought on freedom.

Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants [d] of God. Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king. (1st Peter 2:16-17 ESV)





Youth- Ice Cream social is June 27


Men's group – meal planned for August 15







Highlights within the Synod NEW BISHOP ELECTED

"Congratulations to the Rev. Kevin T. Jones, Mason City, who has been elected to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Northeastern Iowa Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place June 12 during the online Northeastern Iowa Synod Assembly.

Jones was elected on the fifth ballot, with 168 votes. The Rev. Stacey Nalean-Carlson, pastor of Glenwood and Canoe Ridge Lutheran Churches, Decorah, received 118 votes.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor to Youth, Families and Education for Trinity Lutheran, Mason City, since 2014. Prior to that, Jones served as pastor for Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, Marion, from 2001-2014 and as pastor to Blair Lutheran Churches, Blair, Wis., from 1993-2001.

A graduate of Dubuque Senior High School,
Dubuque, Jones received his bachelor's degree
from Central Michigan University, Mt. Pleasant,
Mich., in 1986 and his Master of Divinity degree
from Luther Northwestern Seminary, St Paul,
Minn., in 1993. Jones currently serves as chair of
the Northeastern Iowa Synod Candidacy
Committee, is a member of the synod's
Consultation Committee, and is vice president of
the Ewalu Camp & Retreat Center Board of
Directors.

Jones will take office Sept. 1. His installation is scheduled for 2 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 25, at Trinity Lutheran, Mason City, and online."


