Hello St. John's,

As we move into September we move into another uncertain school year. I got to admit I thought that we would be in a different place by now. That being said Our Father is always in control and he will find a way to use this extended pandemic and all of the stress for our good. As the school year starts our confirmation class starts as well. So what do we cover in confirmation these days?

Well there are lots of ways to do confirmation. You can do a lot of memorization. That's not a bad thing. I like memorizing scripture. You can use a workbook. That's good too. You can get way off of track and decide just to hang out and not cover confirmation subjects at all. That's not good.

What we try to do is to make confirmation class conversational. Informal, fun, but at the same time we don't want to lose the structure. So one week we may cover the Ten Commandments, another the Lord's Prayer, or we might spend a week talking about other important subjects that come up in conversation. Last year for example we spent one week just talking about prayer in general. What is it? How do you pray? When do you pray? Does it have to be formal or memorized? So we try to cover Luther's Small Catechism while covering other things as well. We also play games once in a while but they are designed to help us absorb and retain what we have learned.

If you'd like to sit in on the class, help out some week, or bring us food you are always welcome to do so. If you know of a young person who isn't in our class but might be a great addition then please let me know. Wednesday is the hump day of the week. We all tend to drag a bit but I really enjoy Wednesdays because we try to teach the kids things that they will carry throughout their whole lives. One thing I stressed to those who were confirmed last year was the idea that this is your home church and it always will be. If you move to Australia then St. John's will still be your home church. I know because we hear from folks who have been confirmed in the 1950's, 60's, 70's, etc. Please pray for our confirmation kids often. Please pray for Becky Fuelling and myself as well. Becky does an incredible job of connecting with the kids.







<u>Highlights within our Conference</u>

Hello, my name is ChyAnne Slick and I am a Religion major at Wartburg College in the AMP (Accelerated Ministry Program). This is a new program that allows prospective pastors to streamline their way to ordained ministry without sacrificing any of their education. (Usually, we take extra credits each term, and/or have more homework added on to our undergrad courses). This allows us to spend three years at Wartburg College and three years at WTS (Wartburg Theological Seminary), earning both our B.A. and our M.Div. WTS uses a collaborative learning platform which enables students to attend classes online while serving 20 hours a week in a congregation. The program is a great way to build community and gain experiential learning.

Along with being a student, I am the pastoral assistant at Zion Lutheran Church in Oelwein, IA. I have been working at Zion for a year and half and I have learned so much during my "Covid" ministry under the guidance of Pastor Josh Schunk. Pastor Josh and I met my first year of college when I received an assignment to go interview a person in my field of study. I recently acquired Josh's number from a friend and felt this was the perfect opportunity to expand my communications and reach out to him. Towards the end of the interview, he asked me what I was doing over Christmas break. I responded, "not much." Then he asked, "Do you want to preach?"
