As you know during the Advent and Christmas season we are often competing for focus. We want to focus on Jesus but the bright blinking lights, Christmas specials and programs, music, food, and stuff in general is constantly pulling us away. I've noticed that in the past few years it has really kicked into high gear. The Hallmark style Christmas movie is really big and they make a lot of them. As for me, I stick to "Rudolph the Red nosed Reindeer", "Frosty the Snowman", "A Christmas Carol", "Elf", and other classics. Of those I try to check out a new version of "A Christmas Carol" every year. Most of them are pretty good but everyone knows that the Alastair Sim version from 1951 is the best. "A Christmas Carol' is not a Bible story but I think it's a very godly one.

If you are looking for the Christmas story in the Bible then you will want to go to Luke 2:1-20 and Matthew 1:18-2:23. It's all there and no matter how many times I read it I have never figured out the Christmas star. If you have then please let me know. 51 He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

**52** He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.

53 He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.

54 He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful

55 to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."





# **CLOTHING CENTER**

The Clothing Center remains <u>CLOSED to foot</u> <u>traffic.</u> ALL SERVICES REMAIN AVAILABLE. Items can be packed up for our families/clients upon request. Some families have allowed items to be packed for them, while others have not.

Donations are ACCEPTED BY APPT ONLY! This policy has not changed since the beginning of the pandemic, March of 2020. Please continue to call the office, to set up a time for donations. Dropping off donations is discouraged at this time. It is not acceptable to leave those items on the landing near the front door. With the time of year. where moisture sets in, often items left on the door step, are not brought inside for distribution, sadly. As a gentle reminder, this is comparable to someone leaving items on your doorstep at home, without your consent! We do assist families with clothing or household needs, however, policies are in place for reason. We ask that individuals be respectful of this policy!

**Donations** we are <u>MOST IN NEED OF</u>; Boys size clothing 12mo – 5t, 10–16; Girls Size 12 mo- 16. Men's Jeans (denim only); Sm Kitchen appliances, Pots/Pans.

#### **Never Alone**

Two years ago, Kayla knew it was time for a change in her life. She had struggled with substance use for years. When she was pregnant with her youngest son, Rafe, she was determined to build a brighter future for him. She entered treatment to become sober and create a healthy home for her baby.

While in treatment, Kayla enrolled in the HOPES program through LSI Early Childhood Services, which provides in-home parenting education and guidance for parents of young children. Kellie, Kayla's LSI worker, met with her every week to ensure she had all the resources and support she needed to raise Rafe in her home. They kept track of all his important developmental milestones, sharing smiles and laughs along the way. Whether it was supplying diapers or being a listening ear, Kellie was always there for Kayla.

Kayla is now two years sober, has a job as a chef, and feels empowered and confident that she has everything she needs to help her family thrive.

"I just feel overwhelmed and overjoyed. I never thought I could do all this, so I'm proud of myself," she says. "There are people at LSI that care about you. They are there to support you and they are willing to help."
