It's June and it's a quiet month churchwise. People are busy enjoying the weather, taking vacations, working outdoors, and enjoying God's creation in general. It's tougher to enjoy God's creation in December! Since it's kind of quiet I'll talk this month about a topic that we don't mention too much. I think that you can do it in a way that makes it feel good though.

Stewardship. This is how it's defined by Merriam-Webster's dictionary.

1: the office, duties, and obligations of a steward

2: the conducting, supervising, or managing of something

especially: the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care I like that definition. Some of us grew up hearing preaching that framed stewardship as simply giving as much as possible to the church. Stewardship goes beyond giving. Stewardship is responsibly taking care of what has been entrusted to you. This comes in many different forms.

Tithing or donating can be stewardship but it's also being careful with equipment, resources, time, and the power of volunteers. When you are a steward nothing belongs to you permanently. Pastors come and go and our leadership positions are designed for change. The church as a building and the church body is ever changing and it's never "owned" by one person. The owner is Christ and our goal is to take care of what he's given to us. This is pointed out in the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30). Jesus expects us to use what he gives us and to turn it into something more. Those who do that will hear "well done my good and faithful servant" one day.

Again there are so many ways to do this. Can I share a little way that I do it? When I'm in one of the churches alone I hate heating up or cooling down the church because the church is a big place. So when it's cold I bring a little ceramic space heater with me and shut the door so I'm (hopefully) just heating up a small area. If I do change the thermostat because others will be there I change it back the moment that everyone leaves. Why? I hate wasting resources. I want to be a good steward even in small things.

So I invite you during this quiet month to consider stewardship. How can we all be better stewards? What does it mean? One thing that the ELCA is very strong in is stewardship of creation. I know that taking care of this planet and its resources and wildlife is important to many of you. In the future I will do a sermon series on creation care. There are so many ways to be a steward and I thank God for you all and your wonderful stewardship.





Jack and Dana also attend couples counseling with Andrea and through their sessions, they are able to ensure they have a happy, healthy home for Levi.

The couple says Andrea and LSI have been a "breath of fresh air," and they feel more empowered and in control of their life.
