



Sheeting may have to be replaced in places and the chimney will be taken down as it is no longer needed since the water heater is electric. It was also decided to go with rubber shingles. After much discussion it was decided to hold a special meeting September 18 at 7:45 am. Ervin will contact Ashbacher, Duaine-Allen Roofing, Jeremy-Recker Construction and Jim will reach out to SBC again. The decision will be made with the quotes that are in hand next meeting in hopes that the project can be started before winter.

New Business: The southwest corner of the church has some deterioration around the manhole causing issues with the sidewalk and the brick on the corner of the church. It was discussed that the brick may be able to be repaired with some mortar and possibly put in some gravel where the sidewalk has sunk in.

Heath presented to the council the different roofing products provided by Allen Roofing. Visuals were explained by Heath in regards to colors, styles, warranties, etc. Heath left a contract and excused himself at 8:25am.

Council then discussed the different options and prices. Motion made by Doug and seconded by Janelle to accept the bid for the rubber based shingle described as Northgate/color Burnt Siena at the cost of \$13,250.00 and chimney removal of \$650.00. Any additional repairs needed to the roof, will be the church's responsibility for the cost. The Church will need to provide and pay for a dumpster. There could possibly be up to a 3% increase if the price of shingles continues to go up after the contract is signed. Approved by all council members. Duaine will signed the contract and will contact Heath/Allen Roofing, plus Secretary Karla Schrader for 40% down payment. Installation for the new parsonage

roof will take possibly up to a day and a half. All clean-up completed by Allen Roofing.




