





ST. JOHN FARMERSBURG COUNCIL MINUTES

Date: October 9, 2022

Present: Lindelle Scherf, Tammy Muller, Loretta Weipert, Ken Erickson, Ryan Moon, Zachery Radloff, and Jeremy Wolfe.

Absent: Bill Scherf

Meeting called to order by President Tammy Muller at 11:30 pm. Opening devotions given by Jeremy Wolfe.

Zach mentioned to add fence to agenda. Zach made motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Ryan.

Motioned carried.

Motion to approve the minutes of September 11 meeting made by Zach, second by Ken. Motion carried.

No treasure report related Lindelle was missing deposit information for the past few weeks. Lindelle reviewed fund status. Recent/Upcoming bills: pay Jeremy wages + mileage, Alliant ~\$400, ~\$800 taxes, \$730 missions, \$600 staff compensation, ~\$800 pay in for Medicare.... Zach made a motion to transfer certificate ending in #703 for ~\$2,538.25 to General fund to get budget back on track, motion second by Lindelle.

Vicar's Report: Updates on visitors. Takes clips of visits as proof of visits being made.

Ongoing Business:

- *Parsonage The renter Cody not concerned about insulation in attic or upstairs bathroom fan, so will not be addressed at this time.
 - *Leaking Roof According to Inspector report roof is leaking and need to replace within 5 years. Asked Ryan Johnson who is employed by Nathan Trappe to look at roof, feels it isn't leaking. He recommended flooding the roof to see if leaks. Council asked Zach to find out the cost of flooding roof.
 - *Trees Jones Tree Service \$802 if Cody clean up & \$975 if they clean up, Cody plans to clean up. Ken informed Cody to proceed after approved last month. Jones Tree Service did verify their insurance.

 Lance Hansgartner's quote \$1950 for stump grinding & backfill seed grass. Jones won't grind stumps.
 - *Fence Cody wishes to put up fence by the alley so they can let their dog out. City needs to give approval after form filled out by council. Ken motioned that Cody can build fence once City gives approval, 2nd by Loretta. Prefer that trees be removed then put up fence.



November is National Adoption Month, a time to honor families who have opened their hearts and homes to children and teens. For LSI, it is a time to celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption

services, and to raise awareness for the hundreds of lowa children in need of a safe, healthy home.

LSI Foster Care and Adoption recruits, licenses, and supports foster and adoptive families to ensure every lowa child grows up in a safe, stable environment. But more work needs to be done. Thousands of children in the U.S. are waiting to be adopted from foster care into a "forever family".

A Picture of Foster Care and Adoption

The goal of foster care is to reunite children with the parents when possible. The foster family can play an integral part in making that happen, often becoming mentors to the birth parents, helping them learn parenting skills they may not have had modeled to them.

An LSI provider told me about a picture she had recently received. Imagine, if you would, a photo of two women, one on each end of a bench, and four kids with them. All happy. All smiling. It looks like they were enjoying a beautiful day in the park.

On the left is the birth mother of those kids. She will be the first to admit, things haven't been easy – but she loves these kids.

The other woman is the foster mother. She loves these kids too. Two of the kids were adopted by the foster family, one lives with the birth mom, and the foster child on the mother's lap was soon to be reunited with the birth mom. They are celebrating Mother's Day together.

Foster families provide more than a safe place for children to land. This foster/adoptive parent is a wonderful mentor for this birth mom!


