Secret Santa



Devotions led by Vicar Jeremy Wolf

<u>Old Business</u>: Jim proceeded with old business until Janelle arrived with the minutes from last council meeting. Parsonage roof is complete & no one checked the inside of the parsonage if the ceiling quit leaking. Jim reported the Church outside railing, needs repair and will be completed in the future by him. 
