Hello St. John's,

I just got back from the Holy Land and believe it or not I had 3 Christmases this year. One on December 25 which we all shared together. In addition to that I witnessed the Eastern Orthodox Christmas (January 7th) and also an Armenian Christmas parade just as we were leaving Jerusalem. The church calendar moves quickly though and lent starts already on February 22nd. The church calendar is such a wonderful tool to help us to meditate on every phase of Christ's ministry and advent on earth.

During lent I will share my experiences, pictures, and thoughts about the Holy Land with you and do my best to tie that to our Gospel readings. While it was an awesome privilege to walk in the footsteps of Jesus, Paul, the 12 apostles, prophets, Kings, patriarchs, and others we have something even more precious than that.

Jesus came here as a humble child, lived among us, suffered, died, and then resurrected so that we could be reconciled to God and have access to him at all times. Is it easier to meditate and pray in the Holy Land? Sure, but your placement in Christ makes it possible to go to the throne no matter where you are at and say, "Abba, Father I love you. I need your guidance, your spirit, your help, and your comfort".

As I was in the Holy Land I was thinking about those who came before us in the faith, but at the same time I know it's a great privilege to live in our times now. A time when the price of sin has been paid for. The covenant that God gave to Moses was temporary and thank God Jesus came here to mediate a better one.

But Jesus has now obtained a more excellent ministry, and to that degree he is the mediator of a better covenant, which has been enacted on the basis of better promises. Hebrews 8:6 NRSV

You are part of that excellent ministry no matter where you are. You died and resurrected with Christ in your baptism and you are a partaker of better promises. As we approach lent do your best to spend time with the Father and talk to him openly about your challenges, your joys, your hurts, and the things that only he understands and can help with. It's your privilege and right as a child of God.

The success that Shepherd has had over the years, including 2022, has been superb. All of the donations, from clothing and monetary has created such huge help towards the surrounding communities. I just can't say thank you enough. The Holiday Shop was huge in all aspects. We were able to serve 161 families which was in total 441 children. The volunteers we had were absolutely wonderful. It took 4 days to set up and 2 days to clean up but in the end of it all....It was worth it! The donations of toys, quilts, games, and money helped make Christmas a special time for everyone, we will be collecting new packages of socks and underwear from now till August for our Back-to-School event so if you would like to donate new items, please reach out to me in the office. AS always, our church communities have supported our events and have given generously through out the year and we thank you for your all you do!

Clothing center updates

WE ARE OPEN to the public!!!

A huge misconception with the clothing center is that it is only available to certain people. That is not true. We are first and foremost a thrift store. We are open for all to shop our wonderful selection of new and used items. People who are in crisis needs or with a referral can get some items at no cost, however, our doors are open for everyone to shop. We have had 683 donated bags/boxes of items in the last 6 months of being open and 11,972 items out the door (Not including cash sales made from the public). So, as you can see, the clothing center is doing well and donations are important. Please call to schedule a day that you will be dropping off donations so I make room for your items. If you have not been here in a while or EVER, now is the time to visit us. Most items are only \$1,00. We could use men's jeans, bedding/towels, kitchen utensils and silverware if you have any to donate.
