We're in a part of the church calendar that many people don't focus on as much. Lent is easy to understand and focus on. It's a time of reflection, preparation and a way to get ready for the somberness of Holy Week and the celebration of Easter Sunday. The time after Easter and before ascension is a bit harder to connect to. Why did Jesus spend 40 days revealing himself to the apostles and others before ascending to the right hand of the father?

When there's a big transition it requires extra care. In a company when a long time employee is getting ready to retire you do things to prepare for the transition. How do we move forward without losing the knowledge and skills that the person brought to us? Teams have interim coaches or managers to oversee a time of transition that's designed to bring them into the future. Churches have interim Pastors and they have a special ministry of transition.

I believe that the time that Jesus spent among the apostles and early believers was a time of transition and care. Jesus stated that he would be with us always, even until the end of the age (Matthew 28:20) and so before ascending he helped prepare his apostles to lead the church. What kind of training could you provide to those building God's church? After all, he had spent roughly three years with them. Wasn't that enough?

Those three years were wonderful but they live in the shadow of his ultimate accomplishment. The finished work of the cross. With that work done the church can be born and those in it are reconciled to the Father through it. So Jesus spent some time in between his resurrection and ascension to get his bride ready for the next step. What is that next step?

Jesus is a good shepherd and he doesn't leave us wanting and now with the interim or transitional work done, he will send the comforter. The Holy Spirit not only comforts us but it fills us and is responsible for our best qualities. The Holy Spirit lives inside every Christian and our job is never to quench it! Let it rule our decisions and our hearts. So in the month of May as we celebrate the transitional time after the resurrection and his ascension we prepare ourselves to live as spirit filled Christians. You died and resurrected with him in your baptism and he will be with you, even until the end of the age. Blessings to you.

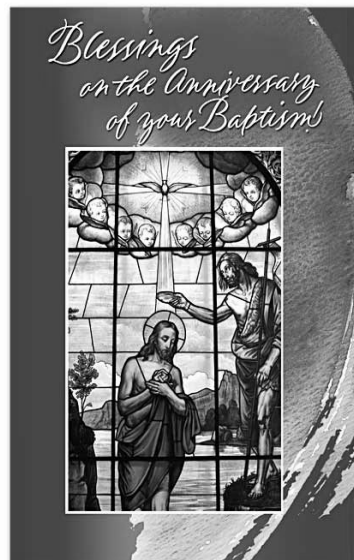

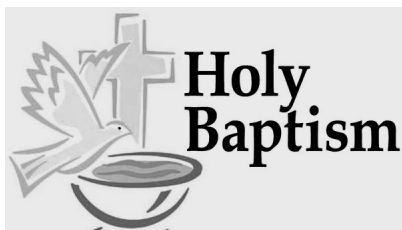

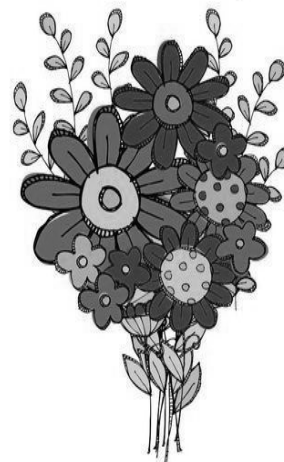
