When you read this we'll be past Reformation Sunday but I wanted to point you towards something that I'm working on. I've put together a sermon series and set of videos called The Essentials. What are the essentials? Well in my opinion the most distinctive thing about Lutheran theology in comparison to others is that we do a really good job of getting to the most essential and important aspects of life with God. For example, the church that Lutherans sprang from was of course the Roman Catholic church. How many sacraments do they have? 7. How many do we have? 2. Why? It's because those two (Baptism and the Lord's Supper) were commanded by Christ himself. I think Lutherans do a good job of this in all things. Speaking of the Lord's Supper we do a good job of not overthinking or overexplaining how the Lord's Supper can be the body and blood of Christ. For us, Christ is simply present in the Eucharist. I like that.

When Martin Luther was a monk he tormented himself because of sin. He desperately wanted to be perfect before God. He also tormented the Priest who was taking his confession! Martin would talk for hours about his sinfulness and when he thought he had reached the bottom of the barrel he would find more. It took him a while but he ultimately figured out the point. We can't be holy on our own. The law and obedience to the law can't save you because who can follow the law perfectly? Only one person did that and we crucified him.

As Martin broke away from the Catholic Church he discovered for himself and rediscovered for the entire body of Christ the most important truths. What are those truths? Well he uncovered quite a bit but I'll try to cover a few. We can't save ourselves. We can't be sinless on our own. Law and Gospel are two separate things. Law is good, but the Gospel is better. It's the good news that Jesus has us covered. His sacrifice on the cross does what we could never do on our own. It covers our sin and now when God sees us he doesn't see a sinner who should be a saint. He sees a saint that is becoming more like Christ every single day. What is our part? Faith is our contribution to the mix. Believe! Believe in the one who he sent to redeem us and trust in the grace that Jesus earned on our behalf. We trust in God's word as the highest authority in our lives. It's pretty simple stuff and thank God for that. Have faith, rely on God's grace, trust his word for it is good. Reformation never stops in the life of a Christian. As we are knocking on the door of Advent, get ready for that season by revisiting the most basic truths of our faith. Those truths are very good!





Loretta volunteered to order turkey gravy for 250 people from Johnsons.


New Business: No new business





National Adoption Month LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES

November is National Adoption Month, a time to honor families who have opened their hearts and homes to children and teens. This month at LSI, we celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption and raise awareness for the hundreds of lowa children needing a safe, healthy home.

lowa foster families, like the Smiths*, raise the bar by opening their loving households to children and teens in need of a place to call home. At LSI, we understand the importance of keeping youth in their communities to help maintain connections and stability during times of transition. So, when our staff received a referral for a teenage girl needing foster care placement, they looked inward toward the community. At the time, homes in the area were either full or not open to accepting teenage placements. Coincidentally, the Smiths were present at a meeting the same night the referral came in. When they heard about Rebecca's* situation, they immediately knew who the child was and wanted to help in any way they could.

The Smiths were already over their licensing capacity, having been granted a variance to accept a sibling group. To be able to bring Rebecca into their home, they would need to be given another variance, which was almost unheard of. "It was by chance, or the grace of God, that the Smiths were able to accept another child, and give Rebecca a stable placement with a family in her community," said Dawn Luetje, LSI Director of Resource Family Licensing and Support, working in conjunction with Four Oaks Family Connections.

Thanks to the combined support of the Smiths, LSI staff, and the community, Rebecca was placed in the foster home, where she could maintain her daily activities with the teachers, coaches, and friends she was comfortable with. Rebecca continues to thrive in a stable, loving foster home environment and a caring community.
