We've settled into 2024 and it's dawning on me that we are in an election year. It's not just an election year in the US, there are 76 nations around the world making decisions this year so it's a time of great decision. Honestly, ugh! 





WHEN AND WHERE DID THE "SOUPER BOWL" START? The effort began in the Senior High Youth Fellowship of Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, SC in 1990. The partnership has grown from 22 congregations the first year to 11,300 congregations in 2000. Worshippers from all 50 states, Canada, Puerto Rico and the Netherlands gave over \$3,936, 124.83 this past year, which included over 4,715 congregations and groups and over \$193 million has been generated since the "Souper Bowl" went nationwide in 1993. Last year 41 local congregations participated in the Clayton County area giving a total of \$5,042.55.
