We are in the swing of lent and it can be a somber time. The weather can sometimes be somber and weird this time of year because we are in an in between place. Thunderstorms and snowstorms are both possible at this time of the year and it's an apt time for working some things out. Lent is a wonderful time to work out some of the things that hold us back. God wants us to be free of things that keep us from love of him and love of neighbor. The little things that hold us back. I have quoted this scripture a lot recently and it's because I think it's a wonderful summary of the Christian life and struggle.

- 1 Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us,
- 2 looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.
- 3 Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary in your souls or lose heart. (Hebrews 12:1-3 NRSV)

After we turn to God we are then faced with crucifying the flesh and stepping into a new nature. Our true nature. Lent is such a great time for that. The sins and patterns that we have developed over the years are holding us back. Can we be stopped? No! Jesus has the victory but when we hold ourselves back through old sins that we don't want to let go of it slows us down.

While you are at, try to add something that will speed you up. More devotions, more prayer, more Bible study, more solitude or whatever builds you up.
