June is a month to celebrate in Farmersburg. We are celebrating our 125th anniversary on June 29th. Bishop Kevin Jones will be here, and we'll also celebrate with some former Pastors as well as some current Pastors who "cut their teeth" at St. John Farmersburg. It's going to be a blast.

125 years of ministry. What does that mean? What kind of legacy is that? As someone who administers and oversees the sacraments, this is what I think it means. Beyond the church building itself, the memories, and the other aspects of 125 years of ministry, it means that we have played a role in ushering generations of God's people to their true home with Him. When we baptize a little one, they are knit to Jesus in His baptism and join Him in His death and resurrection. We administer the sacrament of Holy Communion to both young and old. We affirm that baptism through confirmation, and we feed people constantly through worship, teaching, Holy Communion, fellowship, and other means of grace. Finally, people "graduate" from St. John and go back to be with the Lord forever, and we do that too. We celebrate our beloved children of God from beginning to end. 125 years of that is impressive.

There is also the impact that the church has made in the world that is unseen. Many people are embraced by a local church, and God scatters them out into the world to make a difference there. We may not see it all the time, but there are many out there who have been influenced by their time at St. John Lutheran Church, and they are salt and light wherever they are now.

"Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. ... Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands—O prosper the work of our hands!" (Psalm 90:1-2, 17, NRSV)

The church is changing, and who knows what it will look like 25 years from now? Only God knows. That's not just a St. John thing, it's a universal church thing. We can guess based on things that are happening now and trends, but there's an X-factor at work. With God, all things are possible. This is Christ's church, and several times in the history of the American church, God has inspired awakenings and movements, and God simply likes to engage in the unexpected. I know that it won't look as it did when I was a boy, but that's not bad, it just means change.

This is what I do know for sure. Whether it's the past, present, or future, His church will endure. I know that the work we do is eternal. 125 years of ministry means that we have multiple generations of people who are with the Lord who can say, "I am here because of Jesus Christ, but it happened through a church in Farmersburg, Iowa." The church has had an unexpected impact on me as well. When I was at my home church of St. Patrick's in Epworth, Iowa, I didn't know of Farmersburg and never thought God would utilize it to reach me one day. He likes doing unexpected things, though, and we look forward to what He decides to do next.

In the meantime, we continue His work, we celebrate, and we give thanks for 125 years and counting.




St. John Farmersburg will be celebrating their 125th anniversary on June 29. There will be a combined service that day, no service in Luana. Bishop Kevin will be there.

Amanda came to LSI with many challenges. With a limited IQ and emotional struggles rooted in past trauma, she had difficulty connecting with others and managing daily life. Before LSI, she lived in institutional settings, heavily medicated, and unable to thrive. Her life was a series of difficult chapters, until she found her match in LSI and Megan.

Megan has been a steady and committed presence in Amanda's life. With unmatched patience, professionalism, and deep care, Megan helped guide Amanda from a place of instability to one of emotional balance. What was once a life of uncertainty is now one of structure, safety, and growth thanks to the loving environment of a Host Home.

Today, Amanda lives with "Momma Mavis," her dedicated Host Home provider, who gives her 24/7 care and inclusion in family life, appointments, and even special needs art classes. The flare-ups that once led to hospital visits are now a thing of the past. Amanda is thriving, living proof that compassion and commitment can change a life.

As Bruce C., Amanda's adoptive father, says: "LSI and Megan never wavered. I call this stabilization in Amanda's life. The individual care from a non-family member is needed beyond words. Thanks to Mavis and Megan, Amanda's quality of life would not be possible without the LSI Host Home program."

Amanda, the 25th foster child welcomed by the C. family and their third adoption, is still on her journey and we're honored to walk alongside her.

This Father's Day, we celebrate all the fathers, families, caregivers, and advocates who believe in second chances, and who help make stories like Amanda's possible.
