We're in that weird stretch of the year where everything's both too fast and too slow. Summer's not quite over, but stores are already screaming about back to school. Vacations have been taken, lots of grass has been cut, and the calendar is pointing towards fall.

Since August is a transitional month, it allows for a pivot and questions. Are we getting better or just busier? Because they're not the same thing. And a lot of us, especially me, like to pretend that they are. Busyness feels great at first. It makes us feel alive, important, and in demand. You can look at your schedule and say, "Look at all I've got going on. Look how full my life is." It looks like momentum. It looks like it has meaning. It can be a status symbol for some.

Activity is not the same as transformation and business can sometimes delay transformation. God never once asked us to be frantic. Jesus never said, "Go into all the world and hustle until you burn out." There's this scene in the Gospel of Luke that always calls me out and recently came up in the lectionary. Martha and Mary. You know it. Martha's cooking, prepping, being the responsible one. Mary is just sitting there—doing nothing by Martha's standards. She's listening. She's still. And here's what Jesus says when Martha finally snaps and tries to drag Him into the mess: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her."

(Luke 10:41–42). Read that again slowly. Anxious and troubled about many things/ Jesus doesn't rebuke Martha for being busy/ He rebukes her for being distracted by tasks. For thinking that all her doing was more important than her being. For believing that spiritual productivity trumps spiritual presence.

So I ask this as we move into the back half of 2025: Are you becoming more Christlike? Is your soul softening? Are you less anxious than you were last year? More generous? More patient? Are you more rooted in the truth, more comfortable in your skin, more confident in God's grace?

Or are you just... more scheduled? The good news is this. If the answer isn't what you'd like it to be then August is a grace filled month to recalibrate. You don't have to wait for January. You don't need a program to tell you what to do. You just need to pause, breathe, and re-evaluate.

Here's something practical: take 30 minutes this week, no phone, no agenda. Grab a notebook. Sit with God and ask: What have I been doing just to feel productive? What's actually growing me? What can I say no to? What do I need to say yes to again? It could be prayer. It could be silence. It could be therapy. It could be Sabbath. The world will always tell you that you're falling behind. Jesus never will.

Jesus often calls us to slow down. Sit with me. Stop measuring your worth by your output. Choose the better thing, the one that cannot be taken away. August isn't the filler between fireworks and football. It's a sacred chance to decide who you're becoming before the season shifts. So don't just fill your life. Form it.



St. John Luana Council Minutes July 6, 2025

A brief meeting was held after church. Present were: Pastor Jeremy, Jerry Schroeder, Diane Kraus, Loren Lenth, Luke Steege, Aaron Smith, Stan Dull, and Vicky Baade.

Church secretary, Karla Schrader was also present. Tim Donlon and Heath Landt were absent. Meeting was called to order by President, Jerry Schroeder.

Jeremy mentioned that the music to almost all of the hymns in our green book and blue book are available as computer files for \$99 for each hymnal. The system we now use is very dated, using small floppy disks. All agreed that Jeremy should order these.

Church insurance – Church Mutual is working on a re-quote and the company that insures Beulahland is also working on a quote.

Jerry contacted Benzing from Waukon to do the survey. We are on the list. The survey needs to be done to get the correct legal description of the parsonage property. The next step will be to get an abstract – there never has been one, after that an appraisal needs to be done. After these are completed, the council will have the information needed to present to the congregation at a special meeting to decide if the parsonage should be sold or not.

Jerry talked to Mark Bries about black dirt for the spot on the south side of the church where landscaping was removed. The dirt he has is not suitable. Jerry will talk to a couple of other sources.

Parsonage – the renter doesn't re-attach the downspout after mowing, so rain water seeps down the basement wall. Jerry will attach downspouts with screws.


Jerry adjourned the meeting.
