As November rolls in, there's a change that settles over the world. The leaves are mostly gone, the air has a crisp bite, and we start thinking about Thanksgiving, the end of the year, and the weather maybe messes with our mood a bit. November isn't flashy; it doesn't have the sparkle of December or the optimism of spring. But maybe that's exactly why it's the perfect month to pause and take stock of where we are spiritually.

I like to think of November as a little bridge. On one side, there's the year we've lived so far. The victories, the mistakes, the moments we wished we could do over. On the other, Advent, with its candles and anticipation of Christ coming into the world. It's a gentle opportunity to reflect, to breathe, and maybe even to recalibrate before the holiday rush begins in earnest.

Reflection doesn't have to be complicated. You don't need a fancy journal, a retreat, or a lot of extra time. Just a few quiet moments each day to ask yourself some simple questions: What went well this year? What didn't? Where did I see God working in my life? Where do I need to repent, adjust, or forgive?

Psalm 46:10 gives us a simple, powerful invitation:

"Be still, and know that I am God. I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth."

—Psalm 46:10, NRSV

Being still doesn't come naturally to most of us. We're busy people. We plan, we run errands, we check boxes. But the psalmist reminds us that stillness isn't just an absence of noise it's an active, deliberate posture of trust. It's pausing long enough to recognize God's hand in the ordinary, in the chaos, in the quiet corners of our hearts.

So, here's a little challenge for November: give yourself five minutes each day to sit quietly, reflect on the year, and notice God's presence. Maybe light a candle, maybe put on a little quiet music, or maybe just lean back in your favorite chair with a cup of coffee. Jot down one or two things that stand out. They don't have to be profound. Gratitude for a good conversation, for a friend who checked in, or even just for surviving a tough week all of it counts.

And speaking of gratitude and good company, let me take a moment to invite you to our Christmas Day meal. It's a simple gathering with friends and neighbors and another chance to pause, share stories, and reflect on the year while enjoying some comfort food. Consider this your official heads-up: come hungry, leave lighter in spirit. Just bring yourself and a heart open to fellowship.

The beauty of this month is that reflection isn't a race. There's no right answer, no perfect list, no award at the end. It's just a way to align your heart with God's, to take stock honestly, and to step into Advent with a little more clarity and peace. When the world turns toward decorating and shopping and endless to do lists, you'll have that quiet anchor of stillness and perspective.

November is a bridge, a pause, a breath. Treat it like that. Reflect. Be grateful. Let go of what you need to leave behind. And then, when Advent comes, you'll be ready. Not just for the lights and songs, but for the Christ who enters the world to meet us right where we are.

Take the time, friend. The bridge is here, the path is gentle, and God is waiting on the other side. And if you're looking for a little company on Christmas Day, we'd love to see you at the table.


