Can you believe it? It feels like Christmas was yesterday but Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent is right around the corner. We start our Lenten journey on Wednesday February 18th with an Ash Wednesday service and meal. Then begins forty days of reflection and preparation for the most important event in history: the sacred season where Jesus laid down his life and picked it back up again through his death and resurrection. Our Lenten journey is patterned after the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness and the hope is that we can all keep our eyes and focus on Jesus during that time.

Lent is a bittersweet season. Yes, we have celebrations inside of it. Easter and Palm Sunday are the most obvious but for the most part it's a somber journey. We become more mindful that the king of all creation came to earth and then suffered and died for you and me. It's supposed to sting us a bit. We are supposed to wince a little as we recount the sufferings that Jesus bore on our behalf. We are supposed to mourn our shortcomings and sin that made his death on the cross necessary. It's deliberately bittersweet and our goal should be to use the season to help us crucify sin in our own lives and draw near to God.

During our Lenten services—both Sunday mornings and our midweek gatherings—I'll do my best to give you tools to deepen your relationship with God both during the Lenten season and beyond. My sermon series for the season will be "The Rhythm of Lent". I'll use it to explore the various spiritual practices that we can use to get closer to God. Worship is one of those practices but we need more than that. We need daily time with God and everybody has different strengths and weaknesses in their prayer life. I have trouble sitting still! So clearing my mind and removing distractions before prayer is really important for me. Others connect well to music, Bible study, devotions, or specifics like Lectio Divina or the Lutheran Rosary. Yes, Lutherans use a rosary!

We get so busy, so focused on tasks, and screens and other distractions eat up so much of our time. Let's get back to the old ways:

Jeremiah 6:16 (NRSV)

Thus says the LORD: Stand at the crossroads and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way lies; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls.

I'm looking forward to taking the journey with you. Stay warm and as always God's blessings to you!







Pastoral Salary for 2026 was discussed.

Proposed salary for 2026 (Synod guideline) (3% increase) is \$58,225.82, Health Insurance reimbursement is

\$1200, FICA reimbursement is \$5748.48, Housing \$17,491.37. (Each church pays 50%).

Mileage – Jeremy is proposing \$400/month (\$200 per church) This simplifies mileage recording and reduces cost to the churches.

Portico retirement contributions (10% of salary) (Each church pays 50%)

Jeremy's health insurance is through his wife's plan, which saves over \$10,000.

The TEEM Ministry agreement states that Synod guidelines for salary, housing, retirement, and FICA need to be followed for three years after ordination. (until August 1, 2027) After that, discussion, negotiation, and compromises are allowed.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, February 3 at 6:00 pm at Luana.

The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer.
