It's May and right about in the middle of the month we celebrate a day that lives in the shadow of Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Palm Sunday, and Maundy Thursday. On May 14th we celebrate Ascension Day. Churches celebrate it on the closest Sunday to that date but you can also join in the Ascension Day worship at Ceres Church. It's quite unique. No running water, electricity, or heating and cooling. Just a historic church and a lovely gathering to observe a day that at first felt like a loss.

To the apostles and followers of Jesus, Ascension Day could have felt like losing Jesus all over again. They had seen him die on the Cross and for 40 days after his resurrection had experienced appearances by the risen Christ. This was a glorified Christ, one who used those 40 days to prepare his apostles and followers for his departure and drive home the point that he had defeated death for all who believe. Still, these apostles longed to have Jesus a little longer. So much so that as he departed the angels had to speak up:

10And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes,
11and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:10-11 RSV).

Jesus will return again. We don't know when but he did not leave us without giving us several wonderful gifts. The first gift is this: in his earthly absence he is now back seated at the right of God interceding for us. When we go to God's throne for help, forgiveness, and to seek God's favor we have a savior who gets what it's like to be human. He walked in our shoes, yet did it without sin. He understands your circumstances and is the best advocate we could have. Secondly, he sent the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit doesn't just visit us, the spirit is here to stay and when we don't quench that spirit is responsible for our best qualities. The fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23) and those qualities bring God's kingdom to earth.

Jesus didn't leave us to abandon us. He left to take his rightful place at the right hand of God and to strengthen those who love and follow him. What are the results? You can see it in the Book of Acts and Peter and Paul's epistles. With the Holy Spirit the apostles get smarter, bolder, and put all of the pieces together. 2000 years seems like such a long time ago but in God's time, it's a weekend for a day with him is like a thousand years. Jesus will return one day and in the meantime, we have the Holy Spirit dwelling with us and when we gather, even if it's just a handful Jesus is there with us (Matthew 18:20). I know it doesn't have the name recognition and focus of some of our other days on the church calendar but don't look past Ascension Day. It was the day that Jesus departed so that we could receive the comforter and to step into our inheritance in Christ.

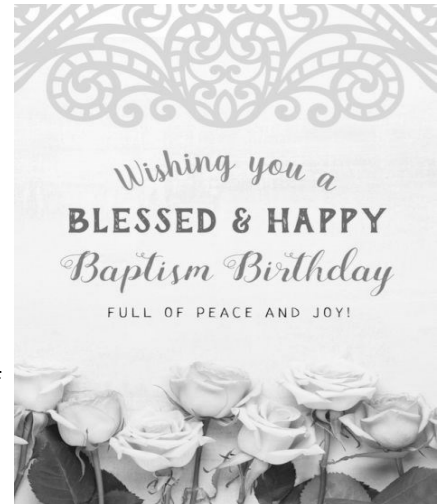



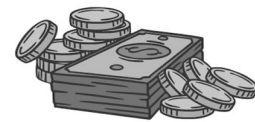
